



## Hon'ble Lt. Governor launches 'Dakshata' - Transforming students through life and vocational skills in A&N Islands



Sri Vijaya Puram, May 1 Admiral D K Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.), Hon'ble Lt. Governor A&N Islands & Vice Chairman, Islands Development Agency, formally launched the 'Dakshata' scheme on 28<sup>th</sup> April, 2025, a visionary initiative aimed at equipping school and college students with essential life and vocational skills. The program is strategically scheduled during summer vacations and weekends to maximize student participation without disrupting academics. The training is being imparted in 09 colleges/institutions and 38 schools all over Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

Pursuant to the launch, Technical and Higher Education Institutions, ITIs and Schools, have swiftly commenced skilling programs under 'Dakshata'. Currently, 3,620 students are undergoing training across various job roles such as AI Foundation, Fundamentals of IoT, Basics of Fire Hazards & Safety against Fire Hazards, Fundamentals of Yoga, and Basics of Financial Literacy, etc., reflecting a highly encouraging initial response.

Essential Department of Training and Department of Education have made provision for biometric attendance tracking for all participating students. After completion of the stipulated training hours, students will be eligible for competency-based assessments, leading to certification aligned with national skill standards.

Looking ahead, the Department of Training and Education have chalked out an ambitious plan to train more than 9,000 students over the next six months, (Contd. on last page)

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## Three new initiatives by ECI Electronic obtaining data of Death registration for updation of electoral rolls; BLOs to get standard photo ID; Voter Information Slips to be made more elector friendly

New Delhi, May 1 Vivek Joshi in March this year. The Commission of India has introduced new initiatives aimed at improving the accuracy of electoral rolls, making the voting process more convenient for citizens. These measures are in line with the initiatives envisaged by the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) of India, Shri Gyanesh Kumar during the Conference of Chief Electoral Officers (CEOs), in the presence of Election Commissioners, Dr. Sukhbir Singh Sandhu and Dr.

The Commission will now obtain death registration data electronically from the Registrar General of India in line with Rule 9 of the Registration of Electors Rules, 1960 and Section 3(5)(b) of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969 (as amended in 2023). This will ensure that the Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) receive timely information about registered deaths. This will also enable Booth Level Officers (BLOs) to re-verify the information through

field visits, without waiting for a formal request under Form 7. To make Voter Information Slips (VIS) more voter friendly, the Commission has also decided to modify its design. The serial number and part number of the voter will now be displayed more prominently, with increased font size, making it easier for voters to identify their polling station and for polling officials to locate their names in the electoral roll efficiently. The Commission has also directed that all BLOs, who are

Primary Health Centres (PHCs), Community Health Centres (CHCs) and District Hospitals of A&N Islands.

The session was conducted by the resource person, Dr. Shiv Shankar Singh, M.D (Medicine), who imparted a detailed training on the clinical management and response to snake bite. The training aims to enhance the knowledge and preparedness of healthcare professionals in effectively managing snake bite cases, proper referral mechanisms administration of anti-snake venom (ASV) and treatment associated with snake envenomation which is considered a critical aspect of emergency healthcare services.

Around 54 participants were benefitted from this virtual training programme. The virtual training was organized under the guidance of Dr. Subrata Saha, State Nodal Officer (PCSBE). Dr. Rajiv Ghosh, District Public Health Officer reiterated the Directorate's commitment to strengthening emergency healthcare services at all levels. Earlier, Smt. **PS Aberdeen arrests two drug peddlers**

In a major crackdown against drug peddling, the Police Station Aberdeen successfully apprehended two individuals involved in the illegal trade of narcotics on 30/04/2025. The police seized a significant quantity of drugs, including 17.52 grams of methamphetamine and 1.5 kilograms of ganja.

On the basis of specific intelligence inputs, two separate raids were conducted by the dedicated team comprising of Sub Inspector Abhishek Haldar, HC Sunil Singh Yadav, PCs Jagdish Babu,

Jayraj, Surender Singh Yadav, Reya Mondal, and C.H Dhanalakshmi led by Insp. Vishal Ram, SHO PS Aberdeen. In the first raid one street vendor Zulfikar Khan, S/o Late Nazakath Ali Khan, (38) Years R/o House No. 21, Round Basti was arrested from his house with 17.52 grams of Methamphetamine.

The second raid was conducted at Mazar Pahad area in a rented room. The raid leads to the apprehension of one Diving Instructor Alapati Mani Raju, S/o Sh. Alapati Kota Satyanarayana, (27) years, R/o Mazar Pahad

with 1.5 KG ganja.

Following the arrests, two separate cases have been registered against both the accused persons and further investigation is ongoing. The police are committed to pursuing all leads and ensuring that the full extent of the illegal narcotics trade in the region is exposed and dismantled.

The entire raid was supervised by Shri Vikas, IPS, Sub Divisional Police Officer, South Andaman under the overall supervision of Shri Manoj Kumar Meena, IPS, Senior Superintendent of Police, South Andaman District, a press release from SSP (SA) said.

**Anti-Narcotics Police seizes 1.510 kg of ganja; two arrested**

In line with its unwavering commitment to combat drug-related activities, the Anti-Narcotics Police Station, executed a highly successful Anti-Narcotics Operation on Apr. 29, 2025.

Acting on specific intelligence inputs, a dedicated Police Team from Anti-Narcotics Police Station, led by Inspector Sahil Shamsudeen, In-Charge, Anti-Narcotics Police Station, carried out this operation which included SI S Sudharsanan, ASI Sanjay Yadav, PC Ratan Das, PC M. Raja Rao, PC Nanak Singh, PC Tamil Selvam, and PC Nandita Mistry. The operation was conducted under the overall leadership of Shri Manish Kumar, Dy.SP (Narcotics).

The team swiftly moved to intercept a Narcotic delivery at the Blue Dart Courier, Gurudwara Line, Sri Vijaya Puram. The information indicated that one Md. Tabrez, S/o Shri Bavara Mansuri, 21 yrs, R/o rented at Allaudin, House near TTI College, Garacharma, Permanent R/o Ward

No.12, Naugachhia, Bhagalpur, Bihar was scheduled to collect a suspicious parcel containing contraband. During the raid, the team recovered 1.510 kilograms of ganja, cleverly concealed inside a Carton Box.

The contraband was seized, and the accused person was arrested on the spot after observing all codal formalities as per Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. The entire search and seizure process was digitally documented through E-Saakshya.

During the course of an on-going investigation, it has been revealed that the accused was acting on instructions from Mohammed Puhari, S/o Late Peer Sultan, 50 years, a resident of Ward No. 3, Near Primary School, Teylerabad. Puhari had directed Tabrez to procure ganja from Bihar for resale, with an agreement to share the proceeds equally. Mohammed Puhari was subsequently arrested. Further, investigation revealed that the accused Mohammed Puhari has a previous criminal background and is an accused in an earlier NDPS case

registered at PS Crime & Economics Offence (C&EO) in February-2025.

Both the accused persons have been presented before the Hon'ble Court and has been granted a two-day Police Custody. The police are diligently working to dismantle the entire supply chain involved in this case.

A case under relevant section of NDPS Act, 1985 has been registered at Anti-Narcotics Police Station and further investigation is currently under progress. The raid was conducted under the overall supervision of Shri Jitendra Kumar Meena, IPS, Senior Superintendent of Police (CID), A&N Islands.

The Andaman and Nicobar Police urges the public to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activities related to drug trafficking or substance abuse to the police immediately. 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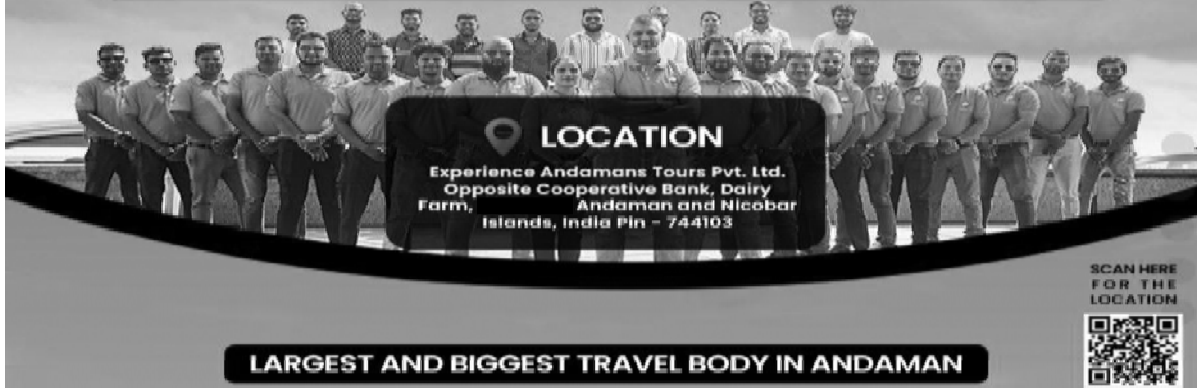
