New Delhi, Apr. 8 (PIB) The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi interacted with MUDRA Yojana beneficiaries on the occasion of completion of 10 years of Pradhan Mantri MUDRA Yojana at 7, Lok Kalyan Marg in New Delhi today. He extended his heartfelt gratitude to all attendees, emphasizing the cultural significance of welcoming guests and the sanctity their presence brings to a home. He invited participants to share their experiences. Shri Modi, interacting with a beneficiary who has turned a pet supplies, medicines, and services entrepreneur, highlighted the importance of expressing gratitude to those who believed in one's potential during challenging times. He asked the beneficiary to invite the bank officials who had approved loans and showcase the



progress made due to the loan. Shri Modi emphasized that such actions would not only acknowledge their trust but also inspire confidence in their decision to support individuals who dared to dream big. He further noted that demonstrating the outcomes of their support would undoubtedly make them feel proud of their contribution to fostering growth and success.

Speaking to Shri Gopi Krishna, an

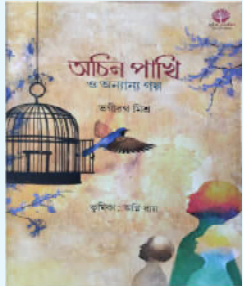

ICAR-KVK Nimbudera conducts Diagnostic Investigation on Fish Mortality triggered by sudden rainfall in N&M Andaman

Sri Vijaya Puram, Apr. 8
In response to alarming reports of fish mortality following recent unpredictable and intense rainfall in the North and Middle Andaman District, a diagnostic field visit was conducted by Shri Subam Debroy, Subject Matter Specialist (Aquaculture), along with Dr. V. Damodaran, Senior Scientist and Head, ICAR-KVK, Nimbudera. The visit covered key aquaculture sites across Rangat and Mayabunder Blocks, focusing on affected farmers' ponds. The sudden and excessive rainfall led to significant changes in water quality parameters in inland fish ponds, including a sharp drop in water temperature, depletion of dissolved oxygen levels, and fluctuations in pH. Preliminary observations indicated that these abrupt environmental shifts were the primary cause of mortality among commonly cultured species.



prevent the inflow of water from adjacent paddy fields and maintain stable pond conditions. Farmers were advised to operate aeration pumps for at least 30 minutes during the evening hours to enhance oxygen levels and ensure proper water circulation.

It was recommended to apply potassium permanganate at a rate of 200-300 g per 0.1 ha of water area to control bacterial infections and improve overall water quality. The use of a salt solution (1 kg of salt in 50 litres of water) was also

advised as a disinfectant. Additionally, the application of agricultural lime based on observed pH levels and water colour was suggested to regulate pond acidity and promote a healthier aquatic environment. Farmers were sensitized on the importance of regular monitoring of water quality parameters, especially during changing weather conditions and were encouraged to adopt climate-resilient aquaculture practices, a press release from CIARI said.
